## 1000 Books Before Kindergarten

Coming to our community. After hearing patrons inquire, doing some research, and receiving funding we are happy to announce a new program, 1000 Books Before Kindergarten, will be offered in 2017. This program will help parents give their children a solid learning foundation before they start school and encourage bonding between the parent and child. Participating in 1000 books Before Kindergarten will help start your child on the right track.

1000 books might sound daunting. Think of it this way and it's not so bad. If you read a book a day you will read just over 1000 books in three years. Or read 2 books a day and you will be finished in only one year.

So what do you read? You can read library books or books from your child's collection at home. You can read the same book as many times as you like. You may count books read by family members, at preschool and day care and those that are listened to on CD or over the internet. Just make sure you read the entire book to count it. You do not need to remember the name, just the number of books read!

At each 100 milestone your child will receive a sticker and get their name added to the 1000 Book wall. At milestone 200 your child will receive a backpack. At milestones 400 and 1000 your child will receive their very own book. Upon completing the 1000 books your child will get a certificate of completion and have their picture sent to the paper and put on our wall of fame.
