Meet the Author Bill O'Reilly

Bill O'Reilly was born on September 10, 1949. As a child Bill attended a Catholic school.



Bill holds a degree in history and a master's degree in broadcast journalism. While attending Marist College he played semi-professional baseball. Before returning to school to earn a masters degree in Boston University he taught English and history in a high school in Miami.

Bill was married to Maureen McPhilmy and had two children, a son and a daughter. Their marriage ended in 2011 after 15 years. Bill currently lives in Long Island.

Bill has been in broadcasting for 42 years. He has been a national correspondent for CBS News and ABC News as well as other high profile jobs. He is a three time Emmy Award winner as well as other reporting awards. For the last 20 years Bill worked for Fox News hosting the O'Reilly Factor. He was terminated from Fox this year. He currently has is own podcast, similar to the O'Reilly Factor, available by subscription from his website, www. billoreilly.com,

Bill also writes political nonfiction books with most on killings of famous, historical people. His first book, *Killing Lincoln*, was published in 2011. Four of the *Killing* series have hit number one on the Best Seller's list and several have been adapted for TV by National Geographic. He has also written young reader editions of some of the books in the *Killing* series.

The newest book in the *Killing* series is *Killing England*. The library has this book and many others in the series. The library also caries some of the books in the children's edition.

Bill is the writer for the *Killing* series and Matin Dugard is his researcher.
